Learning Intent

Home Reading

All the children will be offered a book to bring home share and enjoy with you. Please return their book to pre-school the following week and put it in the book bag box near the sink in the small hall. Pre-school bookbags are available to buy, cost is £7.00 new or £3 second hand.

Clothing & Pegs

Thank you for making sure all the children are in comfortable clothes for pre-school. It is advisable that children don't wear their best clothes & have clothes that are easy to pull up & down. There is still uniform available, including some second-hand uniform, if you have not had a chance to buy it yet. Please also remember a named waterproof coat, wellies etc if it is likely to be wet as we have outside play every day! Don't forget to leave a change of clothes in a bag on your child's peg. Please do not leave any food, medication or toys in their bags. Please ensure everything is clearly labelled to make sure that they are returned to your child.

Trays

Please remember to check your child's tray at the end of each session.

Lunch Club

Please name all lunch boxes and water bottles.

Please note: Sausages and grapes should be sliced lengthways to avoid choking. We are not able to heat up food but you can bring hot food in a thermos flask if preferred.

We are a NUT FREE pre-school so please no products containing nuts.

Snack Time

Please bring fruit, (but no raisins), vegetables and healthy snacks for the children to share at snack time. Do keep us updated with any information regarding allergies. Your contributions are valued.
